The Pastor's Ponderings Your Christian Vocation

Dear, Beloved Children of God, Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus!

In recent sermons, I have spoken several times about our calling through our baptism – and that each of us are called to serve God in our daily life. These are ideas that emerged from the Protestant Reformation as Martin Luther spoke about the idea that all are called into a Christian vocation. This was in contrast to the ideas of the time – that there were those who had a "higher calling" (priests, monks, friars, and nuns) and ... others.

In contrast, the Protestant Reformation meant that the work of Jesus on the cross was enough for our salvation – we could not improve our lot with God by our own works – which means this "higher calling" isn't higher or more holy than other types of work.

This means that all of us – each and every single person – is called into a Christian vocation. Sometimes our vocation is tied to our employment, but sometimes it is something else. Frederick Buechner described Christian Vocation in his book *Wishful Thinking* this way: "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." Each of

us have a Christian vocation.

At one point, I was living out my Christian vocation through my employment as a social worker. I also feel like I could express my Christian vocation when I was volunteering for an animal rescue group. I have spoken with people who see their Christian vocation in parenthood (or grandparenthood). I know someone who felt she was living out her Christian vocation as an EMS worker. Another lived out their Christian vocation being an informal mentor and friend. Or as a spouse. Or as a part of secular employment where they are able to show God's love in some way.

Our Christian vocation is where our great joy meets the world's great need.

What is your Christian vocation? Notice that I didn't ask "Do you have a Christian vocation" – because whether you are aware of it or not, you have one! How can your church support you in your Christian vocation? These aren't rhetorical questions – let me know or talk to me about a time to have a conversation to identify what God is calling you to.

Music Moment: "Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ!"

Part of ministry I have discovered a joy for is identifying music for our worship service. With the help of our Worship/Music/Memorial committee, we identify songs that (1) align with the scripture readings of the day (2) are (hopefully!) familiar or simple enough to pick up quickly and (3 – and this is a Pastor Sharilyn insistence) have reasonably good theological ideas.

In that light, I'm excited to offer a brief reflection monthly on a hymn that fits a lot of these requirements – and share what I see as the important message within that song. In February, that song is "Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ" (WOV 754)



1 Let us talents and tongues employ, reaching out with a shout of joy: bread is broken, the wine is poured, Christ is spoken and seen and heard.

This verse speaks so clearly of the reality that Christ is present in our sacrament of Holy Communion. Jesus is present! Right there! For us to see, taste, experience. What a joyful thing!

2 Christ is able to make us one, at the table he sets the tone, teaching people to live to bless, love in word and in deed express.

In addition to Christ being present at the sacrament, the presence of Jesus binds us. There is a reason that our sacrament is also called "communion" – we are in communion with God and through that communion with God we are in communion with one another.

3 Jesus calls us in, sends us out bearing fruit in a world of doubt, gives us love to tell, bread to share: God (Immanuel) ev'rywhere!

What a glorious thing; we get the opportunity – the GIFT – to be God's active presence in the world. We get to bring God to others through our words and our actions. We are fed with that love and grace so fully that God spills out from us – for us to be able to better love and serve our neighbor.
