The Pastor's Ponderings



Dear, beloved, children of God – may the peace of God in Christ Jesus be yours in abundance! Amen!

Valentine's Day is a – now largely secular – holiday that is often considered a "Hallmark Holiday" (that is, one of the holidays that seems to be around primarily to support the greeting card and gift-giving industries). However, the history of this festival has an interesting history – both Christian and otherwise.

Many historians are of the opinion that St. Valentine's Day was placed where it was in order to supplant the Roman festival of Lupercalia. This holiday was practiced with ... well, a lot of disturbing rites and practices (look it up if you're really interested). In all, it was intended to purify the cities and encourage fertility. There were priests called "Luperci" (meaning 'wolf') which were tied to the Roman mythology of Romulus and Remus "Founders of Rome."

Later – somewhere around the 3rd Century there was a priest with the name "Valentine." There are many stories about this priest, and it is likely that all of them have kernels of truth right alongside fables and myths. The core of the reason Valentine was martyred is his performing marriages of young couples. The Roman government often didn't want young men to marry since married men tend to make less biddable soldiers. Valentine helped young men avoid military service by performing unauthorized marriages which landed him imprisoned and eventually martyred for his faith. There is another story that says the priest fell in love with the jailer's daughter during his imprisonment. Before his execution he wrote her a last letter and signed it "From your Valentine."

As Christianity became the dominant faith in the Roman Empire, the government wanted to quash the celebration of the pagan holiday Lupercalia. As a result, the Feast of St. Valentine was to be celebrated on February 14. With time and additional influence by artists such as Chaucer and Shakespeare, St. Valentine became the patron saint not only of young married couples but of courtly love, romance, and lovers. Today, St. Valentine is recognized by



Ash Wednesday is the same day as Valentine's Day this year! While it isn't exactly a good match between this most secular and religious holiday, Ash Wednesday is a beautiful start to the beginning of Lent and our 40 days of reflection before the celebration of Easter.

In light of the calendar, we are trying something new this year! Let's gather the Tuesday before for a combination Valentine's and Mardi Gras themed celebration! Going by many different names (Carnival, Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday, Fat Tuesday) the day before Ash Wednesday was often celebrated as a type of "last big hurrah" before the fasting and somber mood of Lent. Many people gave up things such as meat, fats, sweets, and other food items during Lent, so the Tuesday before provided a feast of all those rich foods that would not be eaten for the next 40 days. Parties, dancing, parades - anything that wouldn't be permitted during Lent - was common.

Our celebration will be a little less dramatic, but join us for a fun night with a pancake supper, kids' games and crafts, and a time to spend with each other before our Sunday mornings become a little more reflective and somber. We will be inviting the community, so be certain to let friends, family, and co-workers know they are invited to join us!

The next day, our 40-day Journey begins with Ash Wednesday. We will have a traditional Ash Wednesday worship at 7:00pm in Fellowship Hall, joined by First Presbyterian of Hartford City. Join us, won't you?

MID-WEEK LENTEN SERIES FORMAT CHANGE

Our mid-week worship will also be slightly revised this year in the hopes of being more accessible to more of our members. While in the past we have had mid-week worship of Vespers, we will be scaling this back a little bit and adding some new elements.
