The Pastor's Ponderings

Last month I wrote about The Solas of the Reformation (Scripture Alone, Faith Alone, Grace Alone, Christ Alone, Glory of God Alone) and today, I want to talk about the Reformation idea of "Law & Gospel."

Let's start with some definitions. In this context, "Law" most often describes The Laws of Moses – that is, the Law given to the people by God through Moses. For Lutherans, we describe The Law of Moses in three different ways:

- (1)The Moral Laws laws that instruct how to live in ways that show our love to God and our neighbor.
- (2)The Civil Laws laws that were given to the people as a way to govern themselves. If you've ever attempted to get through the book of Leviticus, you encountered many of the Civil Law.
- (3)The Ceremonial Laws laws that were given to guide the people in the proper way to worship including temple sacrifice and other rites and ordinances.

Lutherans teach that the second and third categories can inspire or enlighten us, but are not commands for Gentiles. The second is for one particular group and the third is made redundant by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. However, the first category – the Moral Laws – still hold value and importance to modern-day Christians. We should continue to strive to uphold the Moral Laws.

"Gospel" in a Lutheran context is best described as "promises." The promises that God makes to us.

Because the term "Gospel" is also used for the first four books of the New Testament or describing the message of Jesus, people sometimes mistakenly assume that the Old Testament contains "Law" and the New Testament contains "Gospel," but that's not precisely the case. After all, didn't God give Noah the promise that the world would never again be destroyed by a flood? God promised Abraham and Sarah that they would have many descendants.

Because we believe so strongly in salvation through Grace, Lutherans also sometimes have a tendency to assume that "Law" is something that Jesus says "no" to or that after Jesus, there was no need for "Law." This would be a mistake.

"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 22:36-40 (NRSVue)

Jesus gave us Moral Laws as well. Jesus commanded us to love our neighbor. Jesus even gave us new moral laws - to love one another as he loves us. Jesus commanded us to feed the hungry, shelter the stranger, and love our enemies. These are all examples of "law."

The Law & Gospel framework is helpful for many things, but one of the most powerful is in scripture reading. When you are reading or studying scripture and you struggle with how to make it a part of your life, ask:

(1)Where is the Law in this passage? What is the command? What is the moral teaching I can take from this passage?

(2)What is the Gospel or Promise in this passage? How is God's action described or shown? What describes God as a god who would choose to come to earth to die for our salvation?

If you can answer those two questions – or even just ponder the questions – scripture can open new understandings for you every time you read it.

In the next few weeks, consider taking one of the lessons we read during worship and looking for the Law and Gospel in the passage. It can be eye-opening indeed!

Matt Clamme was absent. Paige Walker called the meeting to order. Sandy Langdon gave devotions on Psalm 138. Neil Stroble moved to accept the minutes from the May meeting. Mark Prout seconded. The motion passed.

The Pastor's report is as follows: there were 5 pastoral care visits in May and 4 in June. Zion partnered with First Presbyterian, Grace Methodist, and Trinity Church for VBS at the 4-H Fair. There was a good turnout of children. The other churches will probably help with expenses. Neil Stroble moved to give any funds received from the other congregations to the Junior Leaders/FFA in appreciation for letting us use their building. Zion purchased one dairy steer and one hog at the fair from designated outreach fund. The meat from these animals will be given to the local food pantry. Other churches/organizations seem interested in this outreach. Pastor will reach out to ELCA World Hunger concerning a grant for next year. A graveside service for Mr. Richard Kinney on May 9, 2025. September 7 is the tentative date for GWOH free laundry. Pastor will be out for vacation from September 18 - October 1.

There were no committee reports. Deacon, Drew Walker, reported attendance for May and June between 30 and 40. There were 5 requests for assistance these 2 months. Elder, Mark Prout, said lay leaders will cover Pastor during her vacation. Trustee, Neil Stroble, reported that there has been a toilet leak in the men's restroom that was taken care of. Tim Cain will mow the grass and insurance has been notified of wind damage on the front of the church's gutter. Repair is being taken care of.
